Dear Parents and Community Members,

This marks the third year the Oregon Department of Education has offered an annual school report card in this redesigned, comprehensive picture of what the Helix School District offers.

The purpose of the District Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) Details report is two-fold. First, it displays district level data for four indicators (i.e., achievement, growth, graduation, and assessment participation) disaggregated by student group and grade level (3-5, 6-8 and 11). Second, it provides an indication of whether districts have met AMO targets for achievement, graduation, and participation by student group.

Based on the scores reported, the Helix School District had performance results that varied greatly. Academic achievement and growth did show a drop in grades 3-5, but showed good gains in grades 6-8 and tremendous growth in 11th

grade. Math scores tended to be lower than ELA, but may show better growth in the future as Smarter Balance math assessments become better understood and classes are better align with common core standards.

We promise to deliver the same excellence you have come to expect from us here in the Helix School District. 

READINESS

Elementary Schools

A Kindergarten Readiness
Assessment has been used in the last three years to assess the level of readiness of incoming kindergarteners.

Full-Day Kindergarten has been offered in the Helix School District since the 2008.

Middle Schools

A Peer Conflict Mediation program was started in the Helix School District during the 2013-2014 school year for the middle school students.

Students who apply, complete an application and qualify academically and behaviorally are selected to be part of the Helix Middle School student council.

High Schools

As a result of dedicated teachers and hard working students, Griswold students are well prepared for high school classes and beyond. A very large percentage of juniors and seniors take advantage of dual credits college courses through CTE and Eastern Promise each year.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Elementary Schools

The Helix School District offers Title I Reading and Math, Walk to Read, Full-Day Kindergarten, Reading Buddies, Moby Max, BrainPop, DIBELS, EasyCBM, Elsworth Keyboarding, and Summer School.

Average Class Size in the Helix Elementary School (Kindergarten - 5th grade) is **12.8**.

Middle Schools

The Helix School District offers BrainPop, Moby Max, EasyCBM, Knowledge Bowl, Geography Bowl and Elsworth Keyboarding.

Average Class Size in the Helix Middle School (6th - 8th grade) is **15.3**.

High Schools

In addition to the CTE, ORVED and the Eastern Promise course described below, Griswold High School students benefit from other academic programs offered. These programs include:
National History Day (NHD), Key Club (Kiwanis), Future Business Leaders Assoc. (FBLA), Oregon Association of Student Councils (OASC), Robotics, Lunch Tutorial.

Average Class Size at Griswold High School (9th - 12th grade) is **16.5**.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Elementary Schools

The Helix Elementary School
District offers Moby Max,
BrainPop, Spelling City, and
Elsworth Keyboarding programs as
academic enrichment.

Houghton Mifflin Hardcourt -Journeys - English Language Arts Common Core aligned curriculum for grades Kindergarten thru 5th grade was adopted in the summer of 2014.

Pearson - enVision - Math Common Core aligned curriculum for grades Kindergarten thru 5th grade was adopted in the summer of 2013.

Middle Schools

The Helix Middle School offers BrainPop, Moby Max, CIS, Spelling City, Robotics and Elsworth Keyboarding programs as academic enrichment.

Students in grades 7th - 9th are eligible to apply for the Middle School National Honor Society.

Scholastic Code X, English Language Arts (ELA) common core curriculum, was adopted in the summer of 2015, for grades 6th -8th.

iReady Math curriculum was adopted and purchase for the 2016/17 school year for grades 6th - 8th.

High Schools

As part of the Eastern Promise program, juniors and seniors at Griswold High School have the opportunity to enroll in a large number of dual credit/credit for proficiency college courses. A list of Eastern Promise courses include: Biology 101, 102, 103, Chemistry 101, Health 250, 298, Speech 111, Success 101, Writing 121.

High school students also have **CTE courses** they can take to challenge themselves and earn dual credit while attending Griswold.

Students in grades 10th - 12th are eligible to apply for the National Honor Society.
