

**FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Dear Parents and Community Members,

For the 2016-17 school year, the Report Card Rating Details report will **not** display the Overall Level or and Weighted Percent data, but will display the individual Indicator Levels, percent of Points Earned.

The purpose of the District Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) Details report is two-fold. First, it displays district level data for four indicators (i.e., achievement, growth, graduation, and assessment participation) disaggregated by student group and grade level (3-5, 6-8 and 11). Second, it provides an indication of whether districts have met AMO targets for achievement, graduation, and participation by student group.

Based on the scores reported, the Helix School District had performance results that varied greatly. Academic achievement and growth did reflect a drop in grades 3-5, but showed good gains in grades 6-8 and tremendous growth in 11th grade. Math scores tended to be

lower than ELA, but may show better growth in the future as Smarter Balance math assessments become better understood and classes are better align with common core standards.

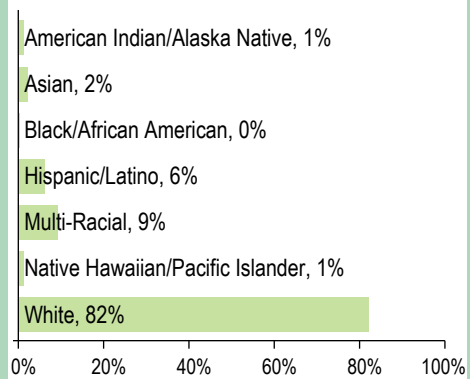

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The Helix Elementary School District offers Title I Reading and Math, Walk to Read, Full-Day Kindergarten, Reading Buddies, Prodigy, Reflex Math, BrainPop Jr, DIBELS, EasyCBM, Elsworth Keyboarding, and Summer School. The Helix Middle School offers BrainPop, Moby Max, EasyCBM, Lunch Tutorial and Elsworth Keyboarding.

Griswold High School students benefit from National History Day (NHD), Key Club, FBLA, ASB, Knowledge Bowl, Robotics (extra-curricular), Lunch Tutorial.

Average Class Size in the Helix Elementary School (Kindergarten - 5th grade) is **13.3** Helix Middle School (6th - 8th grade) is **17.0**, Griswold High School (9th - 12th grade) is **13.5**.

### ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

The Helix Elementary School District offers Prodigy, BrainPop Jr, Reflex Math, Spelling City, and Elsworth Keyboarding programs as academic enrichment, Houghton Mifflin Harcourt - Journeys (2012 ELA Common Core) and Pearson - enVision (Math Common Core) for grades Kindergarten thru 5th grade.

The Helix Middle School offers BrainPop, CIS, Spelling City, Robotics (extra-curricular) and Elsworth Keyboarding programs as academic enrichment.

Griswold High School offers access to the **ORVED** program, **Eastern Promise** classes and **CTE courses** to challenge themselves and earn dual credit.

Students in grades 7th - 9th are eligible for the Middle School National Honor Society and those in 10th - 12th are eligible for National Honor Society.

### CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Griswold High School's Business Administrative & Financial Services Programs (**Career Technical Education**, CTE) help prepare students with basic job skills as well as for post-secondary education.
